Materials

Swarovski Bicone crystal beads 4mm SW4

Miyuki Round seed beads size 15/0 R15

Miyuki Round seed beads size 11/0 R11

Miyuki Round seed beads size 8/0 R8

Miyuki Bugle beads size 6mm BU6

Czech mini drops beads DP

Fireline 6lb or similar

12# needle



Level: Beginner – Intermediate

Length: as you wish

Introduction:

Start with a comfortable thread length. I recommend about 5 feet (about 1.50 meter) for starting. String a stopper bead leaving about 4" (10 cm) tail. Go through the stopper bead twice to anchor the bead. (Stopper bead is an 11/0 round seed beads different color from those you are working with. This bead will remove at the end of our work.)

For 16.5 inch finished necklace you will need:

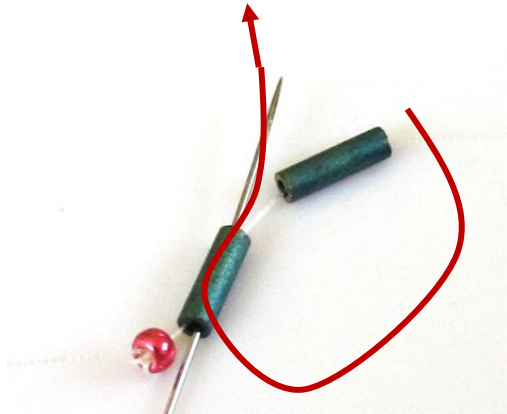
74 beads 4 mm Swarovski 5328

36 Czech mini drops or small dagger or 3.4 Miyuki drops.

Part 1 - Base

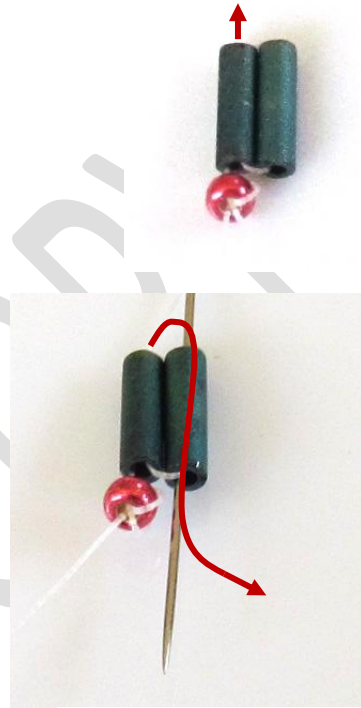
Step 1

Pick up 2x BU6. Close them to a circle by going through the 1st BU6, that you just strung from the back, as show.



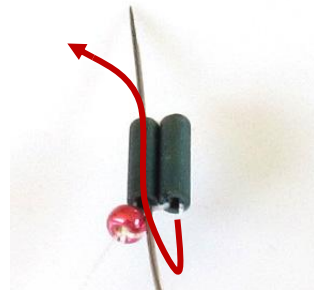
Step 2

Continue without any new beads to the second BU6, as show.



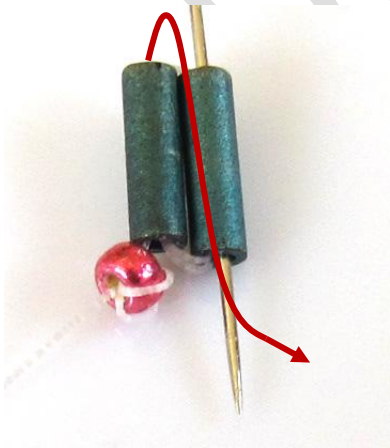
Step 3

Continue without any new beads again to the 1st BU6, as show.



Step 4

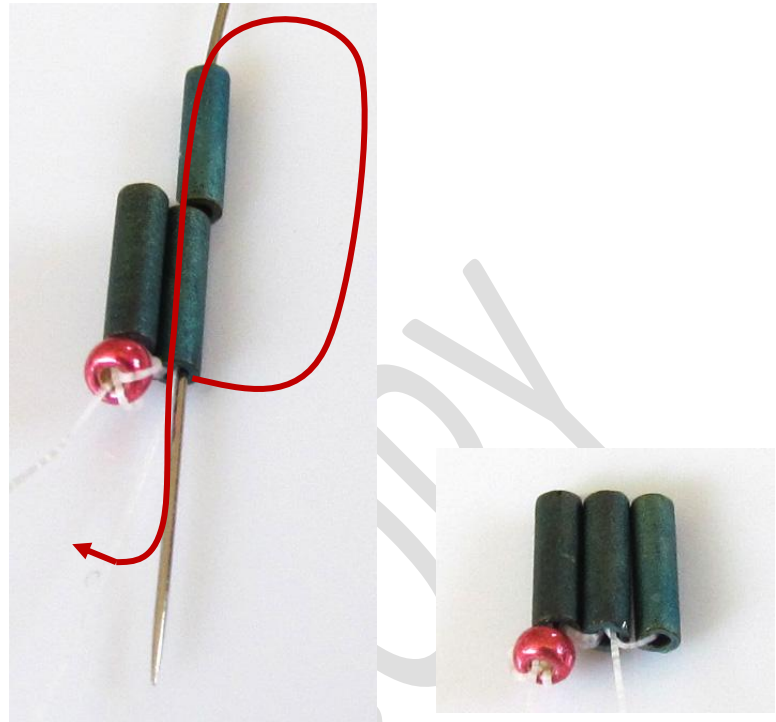
Continue without any new beads again to the second BU6, as show.



The purpose of step2, step 3 & step4 is to anchor the Bugle beads.

Step 5

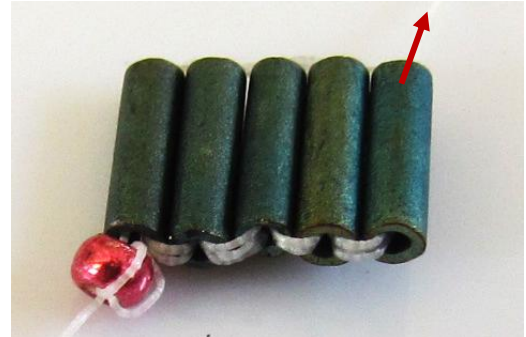
Pick up 1x BU6. Go through the BU6 that your thread came out, but from the back, as show.



Anchor the bugle beads as shown on step 2, step 3 & step 4. Every time you will finish pointing once up and once down, that's OK.

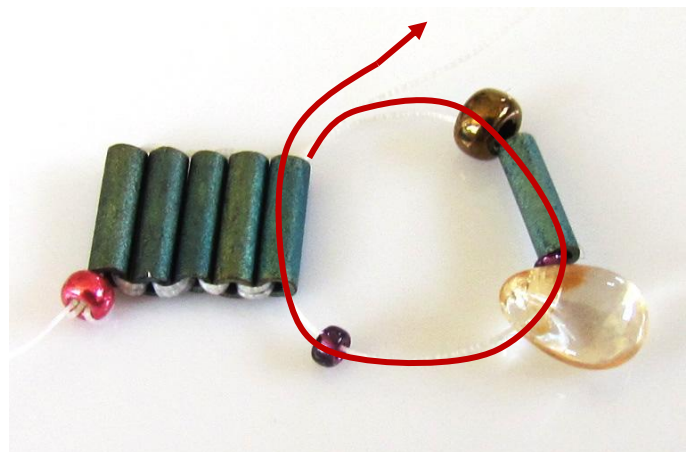
Step 6

Continue adding BU6 until you will have 5 BU6, as show.



Step 7

Pick up 1xR8, 1x BU6, 1x R15, 1x DP, 1xR15. Close them to a circle by going through the BU6 that you began this step but from the back, as show.



Finished step 7



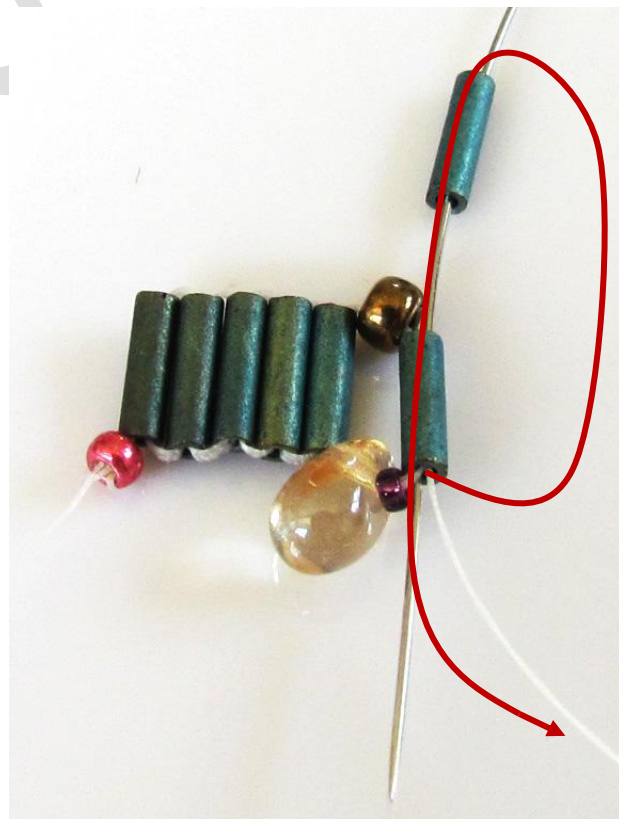
Step 8

Go without any new beads through all the beads that you added in step 7 and continue once more through the R8 & BU6, as show.



Step 9

Pick up 1x BU6 and go to the previous BU6 but from the back, as show.



Anchor the BU6 as mentioned.

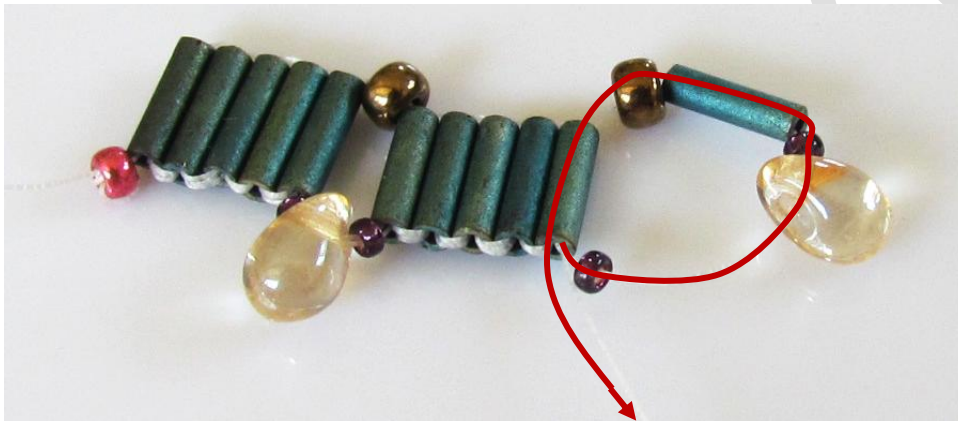
Step 10

Continue adding BU6 until you will have 5 BU6, as show. This time your needle will point down, as show.



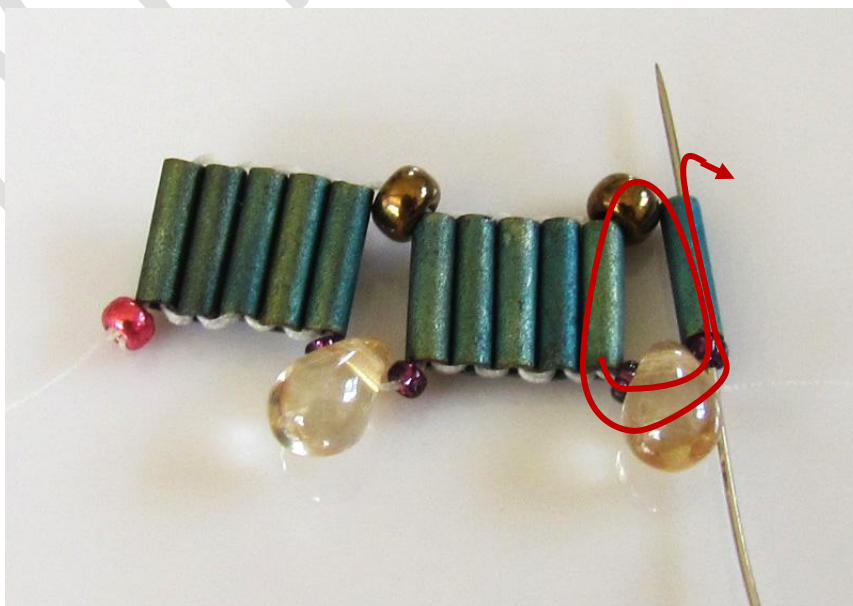
Step 11

Pick up 1xR15, 1xDP, 1xR15, 1x BU6, 1xR8. Go through the BU6 that you began this step but from the back, as show.



Step 12

Go without any new beads through all the beads that you added in step 11 and continue one more through the R15, DP, R15 & BU6, as show, as show.



Step 13

Continue from step 7 until you will have odd count of 5 BU6 sets and even count of DP between them.

Your thread should point up, as show.



Part 2

Step 14

Pick up 1x R15. Go back through the same BU6 that you are now, as show.



Step 15

Pick up 2x R11, 2xR15, 1xSW4, 2xR15, 2xR11. Go up through the last BU6, as show.



Step 16

Pick up 1x R15, 1xR11, and 1xR15. Go down through the next BU6, as show.



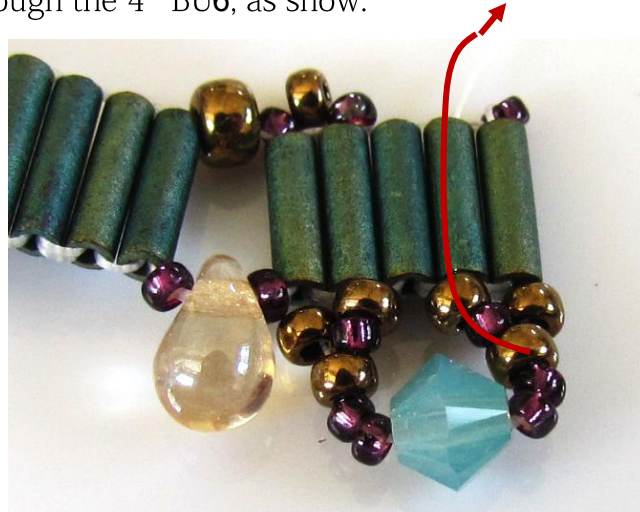
Step 17

Pick up 1x R11, 1xR15. Go through the second R11, 2xR15, 1xSW4, 2xR15 1xR11, as show.



Step 18

Pick up 1xR15, 1xR11. Go up through the 4th BU6, as show.



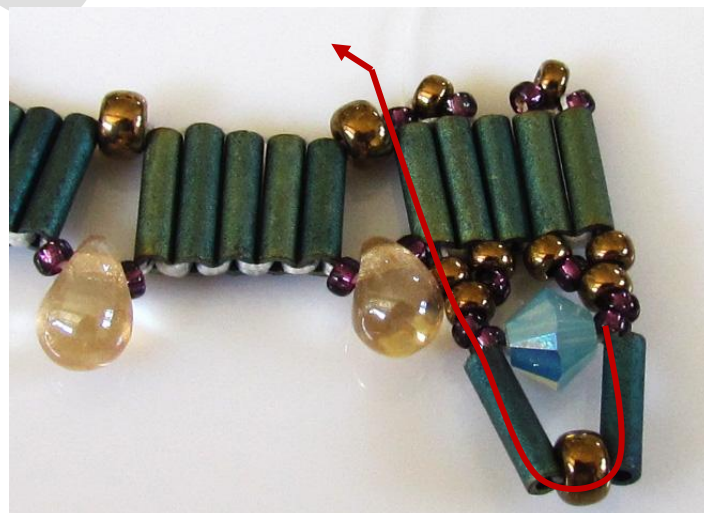
Step 19

Pick up 1xR15, 1xR11. Go down through the R15, BU6, 2xR11, 2xR15, as show.



Step 20

Pick up 1x BU6, 1xR8, 1x BU6. Go up through the parallel 2xR15, 2xR11, 1x BU6, 1xR15, as show.



Step 21

Go through the R8 bead & Pick up 1xR15. Go down through the 1st BU6, as show.



Repeat step 15 – step 21 to the end.

Part 3

Step 22

For this part you will need to set your needle pointing up from the 1st upper R11 and to your work, as show.



Step 23

Pick up 1xSW4 and go through the next upper R11 bead, as show.



Step 24

Pick up 1xR15, 1xR8, 1xR15. Go through the next upper R11 bead, as show.



Repeat step 23& step 24 to the end, and.....



You finished your Bermuda necklace, just add the clasp and enjoy it!!!

- Finish the thread and.....

That's It!!!

Enjoy your beading!
